THE CANTERBURY YEARBOOK IS IN THE DIGITAL AGE! If you like working on computers using visual software like Photoshop or SMARTboard, you will enjoy working on the yearbook. Students will learn to use professional grade software on the Stafford Fine Arts Center mac books. You will be able to choose photos for the yearbook and make vital decisions about how the book looks. You will also be able to see the book before ANYONE!! Parents can help by providing snacks for the meetings, but we are also seeking one or two parents who are interested in helping students work on graphic design software. Experience is great but not necessary.

After School Program Questions and Answers

- 1) Is it possible for my child to participate in more than one after school activity?

Yes. Students may participate in more than one activity. If the dates of two activities overlap, the student must ask the coaches and/or activity sponsors for permission to participate in both. In some instances, the student may have to choose one activity or another.

- 2) Does the \$30/\$50 fee apply to each after school activity?

Yes. If your child participates in three activities, you would pay the fee for each activity. Fees will be used to compensate our staff.

- 3) When/how will I learn about the details of each activity?

The coaches and activity sponsors will provide students with additional information about their activities. General announcements such as starting dates, meeting places, and tryouts will be made in the Chatter. More specific announcements about activity requirements, payment due dates, etc. will be communicated in a variety of ways by the coaches and/or activity sponsors.

- 4) When do I send my money and where do I send it?

Coaches and/or activity sponsors will alert you to payment totals and due dates and collect all payments from students. Checks should be made payable to Canterbury School. Payments should NOT be sent in now.

- 5) How does this impact Extended Day?

Extended Day students may participate in the after school program if they pay the activity fee. Students will be sent to Extended Day each day as soon as their activity is over. There will be no reduction in Extended Day fees because a student participates in an after school activity.

- 6) If I have questions, whom do I call?
