About Our Instructors

Kathryn Kelly-Hensley has a B.F.A. in Art with a Concentration in Design & Photography and has been instructing students in art for twelve years. She managed the McKenzie Gallery in Greensboro and has worked at the Sawtooth School for Visual Arts. She is currently a member of the American Hebrew Academy faculty, and she teaches afterschool art enrichment at Greensboro Day and Greensboro Montessori.

Dennis Nealy is a guitar instructor with over ten years of experience teaching private lessons. He is a singer/songwriter, he is on faculty at Mt. Pisgah UMC as Children's Choir Director, and he is on staff at Central Community Church as Worship Leader. Dennis teaches acoustic and electric guitar. He enjoys teaching beginners simple music theory, beginning sight reading, and various guitar techniques like flat picking or finger picking.

Lindsey Fowler is a strings teacher and performer based in Greensboro. She moved to Greensboro in 2005 and started teaching private lessons in 2008 when she started coursework in strings education. Prior to teaching at Canterbury School she was employed in the Caswell County Schools system where she taught violin to at-risk students in addition to her regular classes. She currently teaches Violin, Viola, and Cello to students of all ages and ability levels. She has performed in the Roanoke Symphony since 2007. Her private students can be heard in their school's orchestra or in one of the Greensboro Symphony's many Youth Orchestra programs. She loves to teach private lessons and focuses on creating complete musicians. She holds degrees from DePauw University and UNCG and holds a North Carolina teaching license in addition to her degrees.

Larry Thee, husband of Joyce, our band teacher at Canterbury, is a retired instrumental music teacher and is actively involved in various orchestras in the area including Greensboro, Winston Salem, West Virginia, Wilmington, Danville, and Charleston SC. Larry has over 30 years of experience teaching with the Guilford County School system. He has degrees from Murray State University and the University of Illinois.

Mary Wing, choral director at Canterbury, holds Bachelor and Master of Music degrees from the University of North Carolina at Greensboro, where she graduated with honors. As a member of the University Women's Choir and the University Wind Ensemble, she has performed at Ithaca College, Georgetown University, the University of

Toronto, and Alice Tully Hall in Lincoln Center. Previously, she was a music teacher in the Guilford County School System and has taught private piano and flute lessons for the past 20 years. As a piano instructor, she focuses on music reading skills, rhythmic accuracy, and artistic expression. She feels that participation in the arts can enrich a child's education and hopes to foster a love of music in all of her students.

After-School Program Questions and Answers

- 1) Is it possible for my child to wait on campus for an after school arts class?

Children enrolled in a 3:15 pm class will be sent directly to Stafford Center when school is dismissed for the day. Children enrolled in a class that begins later than 3:15 pm may stay on campus IF they are registered for after-school study hall, which is offered until 4:45 and only to children enrolled in after-school arts classes. Children will be dismissed from study hall to go to their arts lessons.

A child who is not registered for after school study hall may not stay on campus unsupervised.

- 2) What does study hall cost and how and when do I pay for it?

Study hall costs \$5.00 a day. You will be billed bi-monthly. As soon as you receive confirmation that your child is enrolled in an after school arts class, email Penny Summers at summersp@canterburygso.org to reserve a spot. Study hall will run each afternoon from 3:15-4:45 pm.

- 3) Who will communicate with me about the class?

Once you enroll in a class, all communication about that class will come directly from the instructor.

- 4) How do I pick up my child at the end of class?

Parents are asked to park in the lot behind the Stafford Center and to come into the classroom to pick up their children. Instructors will stay in their classrooms to prepare for the next group of students. Fobs (keyless entry devices) will be programmed to allow parents whose children are enrolled in arts classes to enter Stafford Center until 6:00 pm.

- 5) When do I send my money and where do I send it?

*Email or call the instructor to reserve a spot and to receive instructions about payment. **For group lessons, all registration and enrollment fees must be paid in full before the first class.** Remember that the classes are first-come, first-served.*

- 6) If I have questions, whom do I call?
